

Explanatory Notes – ISSF

- The Hall of Fame Committee recommended that 400 points be the level of points achieved in order to be inducted into the Hall of Fame. The reason the points are higher than in some of the other disciplines is to reflect the importance of earning International points as ISSF shooting is a truly International discipline.
- Future changes to qualification can be made by the NZCTA Council in consultation with the ISSF Subcommittee.
- It was decided by the NZCTA Council to not require the inductee to have 3 NZ titles, as is required in other disciplines, because ISSF rules do not allow for competition between men and woman, they are separate events.
- It is possible to be inducted into the Hall of Fame and be recognised for more than one discipline i.e. a shooter may have qualified in DTL, Skeet, Sporting and ISSF if they have achieved the level of points in each discipline.
