Team Policy

Adopted by NZCTA Council July 2019

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PURPOSE

The NZCTA enthusiastically supports and encourages team participation. Representing New Zealand is one of the highest achievements in many competitors shooting career.

The purpose of this policy is to outline the procedures of what must be done before, during and after selection plus the specifics around some NZCTA teams.

The dates of the NZCTA Council motion are indicated in brackets, where identified.

SELECTION CRITERIA

All NZCTA team selections must be clearly stipulated and adopted by the NZCTA Council well prior to the first selection event (if not otherwise outlined in the NZCTA rule book).

The NZCTA will not recognise any teams that have not had a pre-advertised set qualifying criteria (June 2017)

Team selection criteria must include the following:

- All selection events that will qualify including the start and end events
- How any team place ties will be established
- How many teams are to be selected (includes category teams)
- What level of funding team members will receive
- Who will be the team manager
- Any additional costs associated with being in the team (ie additional uniforms)

Consideration must be given for the final team selection to allow sufficient time for teams and individuals to secure entry into the event, make travel arrangements and obtain required firearm permits (if overseas).

The official NZCTA Team selectors are the NZCTA President, and the two Vice Presidents (April 2018).

The team selection must be advertised in the Gunshot prior to the start of the selection period.

Where possible two team reserves are to be selected. Team reserves will not receive any benefit or uniform unless called to fill a team vacancy.

TEAM AGREEMENTS

All International representative team members must sign the individual team contracts. This is a separate document on the NZCTA website "Forms page".

Failure to sign may result in a place in the team being replaced.

TEAM MANAGER

A separate Team Managers Duties document has been adopted by the NZCTA and is available on the website "forms" page

If the team manager is not competing the funding for the manager is to come out of the consolidated fund, otherwise it comes out of the discipline fund (April 2016)

TEAM UNIFORMS

The NZCTA will provide all NZCTA team members with an event specific NZCTA polo shirt. This to be paid for by the NZCTA. Additional polo shirts can be purchased by team members at their cost. Other items of uniform may be added (May 2011).

The official NZCTA Polo shirt must have the NZCTA logo and silver fern embroidered on. It is desirable to have the name of the event also embroidered (e.g. 2004 World DTL Champs) and, if possible, the host event logo. All team members must wear the same polo shirt.

The NZCTA No 1 uniform is black trousers (or skirts), white shirts, black blazer, black shoes. This is to be worn for official team photos and (preferably) presentations.

The NZCTA Sporting official No 1 uniform is the team polo shirt, black blaser, black trouser (or skirt for Ladies, black shoes (May 2009).

Team Managers are entitled to one official polo shirt but must have "Team Manager" embroidered on it.

The No 1 uniform must be worn for presentations and opening ceremony (if applicable).

TEAM MEMBER ENTITLEMENTS

Once selected, and a signed team agreement has been received all NZCTA representative team members will receive the following:

- One NZCTA team polo shirt
- Two NZCTA banners
- Silver Fern

The NZCTA banners are intended for the team member to retain one and to give one to a competitor from an overseas country. Both may be given away if desired.

NZ representative teams are entitled to one Silver Fern pocket monogram, if it is the shooters first time in a team of that discipline/category. This first monogram will be at no charge. Additional ones may be purchased. The Silver Fern monograms will be discipline specific.

The NZCTA will pay for all International team entry fees from the consolidated fund. Individual entry fees are not paid by the NZCTA.

Any contribution to team members for expenses is to come from the appropriate disciplines reserve account.

TEAM SPECIFIC ENTITLEMENTS/NOTES

Glenn Cup, Glenn Trophy teams

Members of the Glenn Cup and Glenn Trophy teams will have \$1,000 allocated to each team member when the team travels to Australia. This is to come from the DTL/Skeet reserve account on an ongoing basis (July 2019).

All team members will receive one official polo shirt regardless of if they are travelling or not.

All team members must wear the No 1 uniform for presentations and opening ceremony (if applicable).

Any Glenn Cup or Glenn Trophy team funding will not affect any other funding entitlements for team members (March 2003).

Glenn Cup and Glenn Trophy teams eligible to wear the Silver Fern (May 2003).

Australian Glenn Cup members to be invited to our Hall of Fame DTL dinner (complimentary) (October 2015)

Jim McKenzie/Jack Calrossie teams

Jim McKenzie/Jack Calrossie team members will have \$1,000 each allocated to each team member when the team travels to Australia. This is to come from the NZCTA consolidated fund on an ongoing basis (April 2012).

The team manager for the team to be allocated \$1,000 when travelling to Australia. Prior to the appointment of the team manager, the person will be vetted (April 2016)

All team members eligible to wear the Silver Fern.

Sporting Clay/Compak teams

The official No 1 uniform to be polo shirt, black blaser, black trouser (or skirts for Ladies), black shoes (May 2009).

The minimum for inclusion in all NZ Sporting teams be B grade shooters or better (April 2015).

North/South Sporting Clay Teams

The team members travelling inter-Island will each receive \$150 from the Sporting fund (July 2019).

The preferred method of advertising is Gunshot but all qualifying events must be advertised on the NZCTA website 14 days prior to the event (May 2011)

North/South DTL and Skeet category teams

All team members travelling inter-Island will each receive \$100 from the DTL/Skeet fund (July 2019).

North/South Skeet 100 Tgt Events

The preferred advertising the 100 Tgt North/South Skeet events is the Gunshot but as a minimum advertising must be on the NZCTA website 14 days prior to the event. (May 2011).
